THE VERY PUBLIC LIFE OF PRINCESS DIANA

When she died in 1997, Princess Diana had no privacy whatsoever. This was partly Diana's fault; she had invaded her own privacy with both a book and a television interview. By winning the publicity war with Charles, she had made her own life impossible.

With other modern icons who died young—Marilyn Monroe, James Dean, John F. Kennedy—the posthumous accumulation of data led to a more complex sense of who they were. Not so with Diana. Most of what we know about her hasn't changed since she first told her story, despite the dozens of books about her.

Tina Brown has written the best book on Diana to date. Brown tells a sad story all about class. The world of the British upper classes is very different from the world of international celebrity. Some areas where the question of class manifested itself, such as a lack of education, became highly problematic for Diana. Today the upper classes educate their daughters because they know that these young women will need an education in later life. Diana, however, was raised when a strong education was not considered important for rich, upper class girls. Brown argues that the absence of intellectual resources became a real problem for Diana, especially since she did not acknowledge it. Diana, Brown explains, had another plan: she wanted to marry Prince Charles.
